RELAY FOR LIFE

Our speaker, (and a native Californian,) Vita Sargison, provided us with information regarding the American Cancer Society and its Relay for Life fundraiser.

Three of our members raised their hand when asked if we had any cancer survivors, and I'm sure everyone knows someone who has battled it.

The RFL was started in 1985 and now accounts for about 40% of the funds that ACS raises. The RFL is held in over 4500 communities across the country and in 18 foreign countries. Each event is capable of raising huge sums of money for the ACS. For example: Citrus Heights

raised \$180,000 in its last event, and Bakersfield had a relay that raised \$1 million.

Plans are being made to have a RFL in Orangevale this fall. The time and place have not yet been firmed up, and they are seeking permission to use a track for the relay. If anyone knows of a school with a good track that they can use, tell Vita. (ed. Using the track at Pasteur would certainly help both ACS and Rotary.) The goal for Orangevale is to raise \$30,000. Many members of the club expressed interest in participating.
