What is Rotary? “Service Above Self”

Rotary International:

- is an organization of business and professional leaders united worldwide, who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world.
- is the world’s first service organization, founded in 1905 by Paul Harris in Chicago, now comprised of a global network of some 32,000 clubs in more than 164 countries.
- supports the Rotary Foundation, which each year provides some \$60 million for international scholarships, cultural exchanges, and humanitarian projects that improve the quality of life for millions of people.
- sponsors Polio Eradication Campaign, a program to eradicate polio by this year. Since 1985, more than one billion children in developing nations have been immunized.
- carries out, through local clubs, a variety of service projects that address critical issues including poverty, hunger, illiteracy, substance abuse, and pollution.
- solicits members by invitation from business and professional leaders of the community.
- requires attendance at weekly meetings. A member may make up a meeting at any of the more than 32,000 Rotary Clubs in the world.

The Rotary Club of Orangevale, chartered in 1960, has 45 men and women representing a wide cross-section of local businesses and professions. The club meets weekly for fellowship, breakfast, and interesting programs dealing with subjects of local, regional, national, and international importance. The club is located in District 5180, comprised of 36 clubs with over 2000 members.
